OUR JOURNEY BEGINS

The season of Lent is the preparation for Easter. The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word "lengthen," which simply means "spring"—when the days lengthen and new life springs forth. It is a time in which we anticipate the victory of the light and life of Christ over the darkness of sin and death.

Borrowing a phrase from C.S. Lewis, a season of a kind of *"happiness and wonder that makes you serious."* As you journey with us from Ash Wednesday to Easter, be reminded of the reality of our broken humanity, but as days grow brighter, experience with greater abundance the reality of God's redeeming grace. And so, just as we carefully prepare for big events in our personal lives, such as a wedding or commencement, Lent invites us to make our hearts ready for remembering Jesus' death and resurrection.

This year the season begins on **Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14**, and lasts for 40 days (recalling the Israelites wandering for 40 years in the desert and the 40 days of Jesus' temptation) plus six Sundays. The seventh Sunday is Easter, this year **March 31**.

Ashes are ceremonially placed on the heads of Christians on Ash Wednesday, either by being sprinkled over their heads or, in English-speaking countries, more often by being marked on their foreheads as a visible cross. The words (based on Genesis 3:19) used traditionally to accompany this gesture are, "Memento, homo, quia pulvis es, et in pulverem reverteris." **("Remember, man, that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return.")** This custom is credited to Pope Gregory I the Great (c. 540–604)., although this is probably incorrect since Ash Wednesday was not part of Lent in his time.



Dear members of St. Peter's UCC, Let us trust God as we enter this solemn season of Lent. (The following was provided from UCC Resources Lenten materials.)

We are in the presence of God.

Leave the places you have known and walk with God. Leave behind thoughts of limitation and imagine.

But we are secure where we are.

Ahh, but New ways of being in this world is possible for each of us.

Can't God bless us where we are, and as we are?

If you trust enough to move from the places you have known, and question the systems around us, you will be blessed. God is our light and our salvation.

Lord, we open ourselves to you. Direct our paths and open our hearts and minds.

In this place, in every place, for this time, for all time. **Let us worship our God**

Remember, you are loved!

- Everything is going well thus far.
- Trustees will place the "preschool enrollment" sign outside towards Elyria Avenue.
- Bill Hart, custodian, is doing well for the preschool.
- Thank you to President Burman for attending the preschool meeting.

Financial Secretary Report: (Christine Burman for Becky Woods)

• Report has been submitted, and will be filed for the record.

Trustee Report: (Geoff Gatz)

- The new LED lights have really brightened up the sanctuary, and the response has been very favorable. Special thanks to Brian for doing the research, and to the installation team of Brian, Geoff and Linda Gatz, and Mary-K.
- We have been reviewing our contracts with outside vendors. Where possible we will negotiate them down or perhaps replace them. For example, we have drastically reduced the cost of renting floor mats by purchasing our own.
- The parsonage roof and the portico roof are now complete. New gutters have been installed on the parsonage. Still to be completed by Kaminski the contractor: the chapel gutters, missing fascia from the end of the preschool, caulking of the chimney, and coating of the flat roof between the parsonage and the preschool.
- The outside elevator door and the chapel door repairs will be done by Lakeland Glass. They are waiting on delivery of the new thresholds.
- All of these repairs, including the new sanctuary lights, have been funded by donations from various donors, the angel donor, Circle Six, and the parsonage roof insurance.
- No money was taken from any of the church's funds.

Circle Six: (Sally Readinger)

- Next meeting will be February 6 in Fellowship Hall.
- It will feature a presentation on "Kitchen Yoga" by Mary-K. Members of Circle Six will provide healthy snacks. This presentation will be open to the congregation.

Tech Report: (Mary K Kirsch)

- Continuing to refine online videos.
- Goal is for the church to have its own Facebook page, rather than being tied to Mary-K. Possibly do the same with YouTube.
- The new sanctuary lights have made a big improvement in broadcast quality since the camera is no longer struggling to maintain focus in the dim light. Also, the wood tones now look much more natural rather than yellow.

• Legal note: Since we will be having a series of visiting ministers, they should be advised that we are recording and broadcasting them as part of the service.

Website: (President Chris Burman)

- Special thanks to Brian who has the new website almost complete. He has spent countless hours of his own time on this project.
- The new website will be of no cost to us.
- The new website will be administered by Mary-K and Kaye Oswald.

MOTION: TO USE THE NEW WEBSITE CREATED BY BRIAN WHEN IT BECOMES AVAILABLE. MOTION MADE BY TOM HOLLSTEIN AND SECONDED BY DON RAMSEY. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Search Team: (President Chris Burman)

- We have removed the proposed salary range from our advertised profile to improve our ability to negotiate with prospective candidates without locking us into a specific salary.
- The exact amount of compensation including benefits, if any, will be determined on the basis of the individual candidate, with consideration given to guidelines from Living Waters Association.

Financial Team: (Mary K Kirsch)

- The Finance Team is considering possibilities to cut business expenses and perhaps increase interest on our cash accounts.
- Our accountant Michelle will meet with Lauri Hubach to better understand the restricted funds and perhaps be able to utilize them.
- Bob Bove, Financial Advisor, will be consulted for additional investment possibilities.
- To eliminate direct deposit fees, we will return to paper checks for employees.
- Funds will be examined to determine which ones need to be active.
- The Finance Team will review non-standard expenses.
- We will examine the origin and basis for our regular payments to Living Waters Association.

The amount was probably set in an earlier time when we were a larger, more prosperous congregation. It may be possible to have it reduced.

New Business: (President Christine Burman)

- The rummage sale will be held in June.
- The church bylaws will be examined in detail later in the year for correctness and relevance.
- St. Peter's will be represented at the four "Walking on Wednesdays" events with a table in June, July, August, and September. Actual dates will be announced.
 - Volunteers are needed, 4 for each event, to include members from council and preschool. There will be a signup sheet.
 - At the table we will promote our church and preschool, with brochures and verbal information, plus face painting by Christine.
 - Christine is making large stadium blankets to sell, with profits donated to our church.
 - Christine has personally donated the \$50 guaranteed attendance fee (refundable).
- The potluck dinner will be held Sunday January 21, following the church service.
- The Leek Pipe Organ Company is offering an annual checkup/tuneup program. This would keep our organ in good operating condition and hopefully prevent minor problems from becoming major ones. Costs and details will be investigated.
- Pastor Chris's contract specified a certain number of paid vacation days to which he is entitled. Since he left midway through the contract year, the exact amount of unused vacation will be determined and prorated.
- The starting time for our Sunday service is listed as 10:00 which is when the Facebook broadcast begins for the general public. The Zoom broadcast actually begins a few minutes earlier, around 9:50. This 10 minute segment is purposely NOT shown to the general public on Facebook since it may contain personal, private, or confidential information such as births, deaths, hospital visits,

absence from home, etc. It has been suggested that this 10 minute discrepancy may cause confusion as to the actual starting time, especially to new viewers. There are a number of possibilities, to name a few: 1) Keep same procedure i.e. announcements at 9:50 and Facebook broadcast service begins at 10:00; 2) Announcements at 10:00 and Facebook service begins 5-10 minutes later; 3) Post announcement on Facebook such as "Service will start in 10 minutes". Discussion on this topic will be tabled until next month.

• Why does the TV screen in the sanctuary show mostly black squares? This is either because those viewers have chosen to NOT show their picture, or because they have signed in by telephone without the means to show their picture. This policy was actually begun due to covid, and the intent was to allow members in the sanctuary to see and feel "connected" to those at home. Discussion on this topic will be tabled until next month.

Usher Report: (Tom Hollstein for Al Murphy)

- With the departure of Pastor Chris, it will be necessary for the ushers to unlock the church before each service.
- It was pointed out that both the choir and the bell choir are usually there before 9:00 AM. Jennifer Wasilk usually unlocks the door at the Walker lobby. Geoff Gatz said he will ask Fred Helyes to unlock the elevator door. We will try this method and see if it works well.

MOTION: TO ADJOURN THE MEETING. MOTION WAS MADE BY JUDY MCCURDY, AND SECONDED BY JOAN WHITMAN. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

The meeting ended at 8:12 PM with a prayer by President Christine Burman.



The history behind Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day, also called Saint Valentine's Day is celebrated annually on February 14. It originated as a Christian feast day honoring one or two early Christian matyrs named Saint Valentine and, through later folk traditions, has become a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and love in regions of the world.

The U.S. Greeting Card Association estimates that approximately 190 million valentines are sent each year in the US. When the valentine-exchange cards made in school activities are included the figure goes up to 1 billion, and teachers receive the most.
