

## Ponderings about St. Peter's

Did you ever wonder about what kind of financial challenges St. Peter's had in its past. Or better yet, how did they meet these challenges? Here is an early example.

In August 1923 the congregation was informed that the heating system of the church had "served admirably well during the course of years" but had reached a "stage beyond repair". The Church Council had researched the problem and the solution; and awarded a contract to Schmidtin Bros of Toledo at a cost of \$3635.00 cash. (\$1.00 in 1923 would be \$18.15 today.) The contract was for a hot air and ventilating system "guaranteed to heat the entire church property". To reduce the cost some of the men "promised to come out after supper to do the necessary work of enlarging the fuel room".

In September on the afternoon of the 9th, 90 church members were visited to solicit contributions and all but \$1103.00 was raised. It was reported that four people gave \$100 each and six \$50. In October the congregation was asked to dig deeper and an "installment plan" was offered. In January 1924 the Treasurer reported that the heating system had been paid for but that the church had had to take out a loan for \$618.00. Everyone was encouraged to give a dollar a month to retire the debt.
