## Ponderings about St. Peter's

When you enter the church building on north side, the elevator entrance, have you ever taken the time to look at the picture and plaque hanging there? Do you know its story?



The picture shows the Madonna and Child not Jesus as a baby. This was chosen for a reason. The original is an oil painting on wood done by Raphael around 1512. It is commonly called the "Madonna of the Chair". The description of it follows:

"Mary is seen from the side, seated on a 'chamber chair', a type of seat reserved for the high dignitaries of the papal court. She just lifts one leg to better accommodate the body of her Son, clasping it (him) against her chest, while St. John, on the right, casts an intense gaze at them, extending his hands in sign of prayer."

This picture was given to St. Peter's by the Watts family as a memorial for their son, James Dewey Watts (October 16, 1964 – April 12, 1967). James died at age 2 ½ after being ill for several days. His parents, Barbara Snyder Watts and Dewey R. Watts, lived on Telegraph Road. His grandparents were from Elyria and Fort Gay, West Virginia. Rev. Happel performed the funeral, and James was buried at Ridge Hill Cemetery.
