A TIME TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION

Brothers and sisters in Christ, the gospels tell us that on the first day of the week, the day on which our Lord rose from the dead, he appeared to his disciples in the place where they were gathered and was made known to them in the breaking of the bread. Come, then, to the joyful feast of the Lord.

The Thanksgiving

Pastor David: Lift up your hearts.

Congregation: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor David: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Congregation: It is right to give our thanks. It is our joy and our salvation at all times and in all places to give thanks to you, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God, through Christ, our Lord.

Pastor David: Because the light of your glory has shone with splendor in our world. For you gave Jesus Christ, your only Son, to be born for us of Mary that we might have power to become your children through him: who existed before the world was called into being, but came down to save us by being born of a humble virgin, lying in a crib, walking on earth as a man; who became poor that by his poverty we might become rich; who was humbled that we might be exalted; who gave us peace and joy when we were without hope and without God. Therefore, with the whole company of saints in heaven and on earth we proclaim and celebrate the birth of our Savior.

The Institution

Judy McCurdy: We give thanks to God the Father that our Savior, Jesus Christ, before he suffered, gave us this memorial of his sacrifice, until his coming again. For on the night of his arrest he took bread and, after giving thanks to God, broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you; do this as a memorial of me." In the same way, he took the cup after supper and said, "This cup is the new covenant sealed by my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

The Memorial

All: Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free. Glory be to you, O Lord.

Prayer of Consecration

Pastor David: Heavenly Father, be present with your life-giving Word and Holy Spirit, that we may be nourished and strengthened through this supper. Grant that all who share the communion of the body and blood of your Son may be united in him. And may we remain faithful in love and hope until we feast joyfully with him in his eternal kingdom.

Preparation of the Elements

(as the Leader breaks the bread and pours the cup)

Judy McCurdy: The bread which we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.

All: We who are many are one body for we all share in the same loaf. The cup for which we give thanks is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

The Invitation

Pastor David: Come, all you who are thirsty. Come to the waters and drink. All who are hungry come to the table and eat this bread.

The Dedication

Judy McCurdy: We praise you, Lord, for these your gifts of bread and wine. We offer you ourselves in your service. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Pastor David: We will receive the bread of heaven. We will drink the cup of salvation. The gifts of God for the people of God.

The Communion

(when the people are ready to eat the bread)

Judy McCurdy: Take, eat, remember and believe that the body of our Lord Jesus Christ was given for a complete remission of all our sins.

(when the people are ready to drink the cup)

Pastor David: Take, drink, remember and believe that the precious blood of our Lord Jesus Christ was shed for the forgiveness of our sins.

The Thanksgiving

All: Brothers and Sisters in Christ, since the Lord has fed us at his table, let us praise his holy name with thanksgiving.


