Leader: It's impossible to picture the things the prophet Isaiah, for they are not simply so. Wolves and lambs do not lie down together. Bears and cows do not eat side by side. Lions are anything but vegetarian. And no toddler would be allowed to venture anywhere near the hole of an asp. The stakes are too high. The consequences too great.

People: It is in the very nature of the snake to bite, the wolf to feast, the lion to enjoy a meal of red meat. And yet, the prophet uses these opposites to paint a picture of a time when it will all he different.

Leader: It is in this season of Advent we yearn for this coming possibility of One who sits things right—that time when animals and humans alike will only experience peace in the presence of one another. But in the meantime? Even as we watch and wait, it appears that the responsibility lies with us. Not only to cry out in horror or dismay, but to be those who judge with righteousness for the meek and the poor even now.

People: We look at the world, with its propensity to violence and separation, we yearn to make things right when and where we can. For that Spirit has been given to us, to you and me, for precisely this time. Amen.


