
Everyone is Welcome! Feel at home, *for* Christ Jesus is our host. If you are visiting for the first time, we are delighted to have you here!

Ponderings About St. Peter's



This week let's look at the front of our sanctuary. As you face the altar to the left is a pulpit with a Bible on it. From the diagram below you can see that the pulpit itself has changed over time and today it often reflects the

architectural style of the church. The practice of speaking God's word from a raised platform dates back to the Old Testament. Examples are found in Nehemiah 8:4 and Exodus 30:1-3. The Biblical example we are all most familiar with would be Jesus using the mountainside as His pulpit for the "Sermon on the Mount". The Pulpit Bible is usually a special more ornate edition with a larger font to make it easier to read. The Bible is a symbol of divine communication and authority. Our present Pulpit Bible was presented by the Schieferstein Family on March 20, 1955 in memory of Mr. & Mrs. George Schieferstein (grandparents) and Mr. & Mrs. Henry Schieferstein (parents). These would be Brian Schieferstein's grandparents and great grandparents.
