#### THE SERVICE OF TENEBRAE

The word "Tenebrae" is derived from the Latin word for "shadows". Tenebrae is usually done following a Good Friday service, and is normally a service of scripture and the extinguishing of candles, hence the "shadows". Our service tonight is a widely modified form of Tenebrae in which all vestiges and trappings of worship are removed from the Sanctuary. Thus, we are reminded of the somber reality of Christ's death on the cross and His decent into hell to await the resurrection.

There will be no Benediction. When the pastor announces the end of the service, please leave the sanctuary in relative silence.

Dirty and dusty pathways and streets were a harsh daily reality, and a basin of water for the feet of visitors was an act of hospitality. A truly caring host would bend and wash the feet of guests. In finer homes, a servant would do it. So why did Jesus ask his disciples to provide this hospitality for one another? I'm not sure that the hospitality is as important as the act of humility – lowering one's self to the role of servant to the other.
