Ponderings About St. Peter's

Hallelujah! He is Risen! Happy Easter to all of you. We are with you in spirit. The following is from the April1969 Key.

On March 31 while enroute from the Elyria Memorial Hospital I listened via my car radio to the funeral service for former President Eisenhower. As I heard the ministers speak the words Jesus had said, some things Paul had written, and words an unknow psalmist had first sung, a strange thought came over me. The commentator had named some of the over 2,000 people who had received invitations to the service. Heads of government and representatives of nations were gathered – and whose words were being offered for their comfort? The words of a humble carpenter turned preacher, who had never gone to college and who had lived his life in a small section of the earth's surface, a condemned man in his early thirties...Words from a tentmaker-rabbi who had been jailed often, beaten and persecuted...Words of a shepherd or man of faith. Not the words of a king, government head, or high priestly figure of the church – but words from some Jews who had dared to lay their lives on the line!

Time has certainly vindicated the faith of Jesus Christ! He was not a "power figure" in the way in which men then (and now) knew the phrase. Calvary should have ended his movement, but it didn't. Indeed, often in the first 300 years of the life of the Church, there were ample reasons to doubt if the Church would survive persecutions and bitter opposition – but it did! And now, the powerful of the earth bow before His cross and sing Hallelujahs before his empty tomb.

Ah, there is the clue to it all! The tomb was empty! The stone was rolled back, not to let the Christ out but to let the world in to see that it was empty. That an event of tremendous importance had taken place there can be no doubt. When the Gospel writers wrote about the event, they differed on some of the details. (Hardly two people report the same event in the same way – and it is not surprising that the Gospels written years after the event would vary in details. But the central event of the resurrection stood at the very heart of their faith! With it there, they went out and conquered a world as they affirmed what they had seen and heard and touched.

We are heirs of that faith; indeed, this faith is our own. I am not concerned about how God raised Jesus Christ from the dead. That's His business, not mine! I am concerned, however, to know Christ alive within my own life and in the relationships that prevail within the Church and within our associations with other people. I am confident that the Christ I know through God's Holy Spirit in the here and now will also be with me in the "then" that is to come! All praise to His name! Hallelujah!
