# Ponderings About St. Peter's

Music is an important part of our Sunday Worship Service. One of the hymns that is often sung at this time of year is "The Old Rugged Cross", but do you know who wrote it or how it came to be?



George Bennard (1873-1958) is the author and composer of this much loved 1912 hymn. He was born in Youngstown, Ohio and when he was young his family moved to Albion, Michigan and then later to Lucas, Iowa. As a youth he wanted to become a Christian evangelist, however, when his father died unexpectedly, he went to work to support his mother and sisters. He eventually married and became active in the Salvation Army. Later he was ordained by the Methodist Episcopal Church. He authored many hymns, but

this one is his best known. He was going through a difficult time in his life and spent a lot of time studying and praying. (His problem was never revealed). He was reading what Paul wrote in Philippines 3:10 about "entering into the fellowship of Christ's sufferings" when he was inspired to sit down at his kitchen table and write the lyrics for this hymn. It was set to a melody he had composed at Christmastime.

"I saw the Christ of the cross as if I were seeing John 3:16 leave the printed page, take form, and act out the meaning of redemption. The more I contemplated these truths, the more convinced I became that the cross was far more than just a religious symbol but rather the very heart of the gospel."
