This week we will celebrate our country's 249th birthday. Many of you know the story of our National Anthem: "The Star-Spangled Banner". During the War of 1812, weeks after the British had attacked Washington, D.C. and burned our Capitol Building, Treasury, and the White House, they attacked a major port, Baltimore, Maryland. It was there after 25 hours of bombing Fort McHenry that Francis Scott Key wrote the words to our anthem on the back of an envelope. The words were set to a popular English tune and became an immediate hit. It wasn't until 1931 that Congress officially made it our national anthem. The song has four verses. I wonder why we only sing the first! Below is the last verse and as you read the words note their significance. This is also where our country's motto is found. O thus be it ever, when freemen shall stand
