

Ponderings about St. Peter's

On occasion we hear lovely music from the grand piano in our sanctuary. Do you ever wonder about the history of this beautiful instrument?







In 1937 St. Peter's Evangelical-Reformed Church marked its 80 years as a church in Amherst. To commemorate this achievement two services were held; one in the morning with more than 600 people attending and one in the evening which drew another large crowd. During the service recognition was given to the donors of recent large gifts. One of these gifts was our piano. It was given by Mr. & Mrs. John J. Wiegand. John was born in Germany in 1865 and arrived in the United States in 1895. He worked as a quarryman and boarded with the Ruths (members of St. Peter's). In 1904 he married Mary Chalmers. The 1910 Census shows him as a farmer. He moved to Amherst in1911 and worked in a machine shop. Mary died in 1923. His second wife was Kathryn. Both wives were active in the women's groups of the church.

Our piano was built by the A. B. Chase Piano Company which was founded in 1875 in Norwalk, Ohio. They were known for making instruments of "superior quality". As the company grew, it expanded its operations and moved to New York City. Today Chase Pianos are still desirable and have great value; a 1927 A. B. Chase baby grand recently sold for \$29,550. In the July of 1981, our piano was removed from the sanctuary for refinishing. It was returned in August.

GriefShare®, Friday, Nov. 14, 2025 6:30-8:30 p.m.

We will be hosting "Surviving the Holidays", a two-hour grief facilitation program from GriefShare®, a product of Church Initiatives Inc. This program is designed to help bereaved people face their first or second* holiday season without their loved one. (Note: This is not the same as a Blue Christmas service that many churches offer).
