Ponderings about St. Peter's

One of St. Peter's missions is "Caring for Others". In exploring our past this has been something our church has done since its founding. Here is an example.

The first meeting of the St. Peter's Missionary Society was held in the church parlors on Thursday, February 21, 1924. Its objective was to #1- Educate and familiarize members about missionary conditions both at home and abroad; and #2-. Promote and better these conditions as best we can. The 15 members agreed to meet on the third Thursday of the month. and to pay dues of a minimum of 10 cents a month. Officers were elected, committees were formed, and the Executive Committee was tasked with writing a constitution for the group. Over the years they purchased study books to grow their knowledge and understanding of foreign lands. For example, in 1926 they studied "Building with India". True to their stated purpose they helped families in Lorain after the tornado; supported an orphanage in Jerusalem and a Honduras Boarding School; sent medical supplies to a hospital in India; and supported the Red Cross. These are only a few examples. In 1925 they contributed \$91.00 to foreign missions which today would amount to \$1671.62. Over the years this society would grow and stay true to their mission. What a wonderful heritage these ladies left for us.
