

Ponderings about St. Peter's

This is the Sunday we celebrate “Epiphany” and the arrival of the “Magi” with their gifts for the “Christ Child”. It is one of the oldest Christian feast days. Here are some quick facts about the Wise Men in the Bible.

1. The Magi were wise men; they had knowledge of astronomy
2. The Magi were like the Prophet Daniel
3. The Magi were most likely believers in Yahweh and the Coming Messiah
4. They came from the East – most likely from Persia, Babylon or Arabia – they traveled 800-900 miles to find Jesus
5. There might have been more than 3 Wise Men. They certainly would not have been traveling alone; and would each have had an entourage with them
6. The gifts made Joseph, Mary and Jesus wealthy

7. Herod feared and respected the Magi
8. The Magi were not at the birth of Jesus – Jesus was most likely 2-3 years old when they found him
9. The Magi believed that God spoke in dreams
10. In the 3rd Century the Magi were considered Kings and were given names **Caspar**, representing youth had brown hair & beard, was dressed in green, brought frankincense and came from Asia, **Balthazar**, representing maturity, had a black beard, brought myrrh and was from Africa, **Melchior**, represented old age, had white hair & beard, was dressed in gold, brought gold and came from Europe
11. Only the Gospel of Matthew mentions the Magi

New Year's Resolutions


