Ponderings about St. Peter's

One of the songs we hear during the Christmas Season is "the Twelve Days of Christmas". The words were written by Catholic Clerics and the song itself dates to 18th C England. It was used as a memory game and teaching tool for children to help them learn about the Christian faith. The 12 days begin on December 25th with the birth of Jesus and continue until January 5th the 12th Night when the Magi appear.

A Partridge in a Pear Tree: Represents Jesus Christ, symbolizing God's love and sacrifice.

Two Turtle Doves: Symbolize the Old and New Testaments, reflecting the complete story of salvation.

Three French Hens: Represent the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love.

Four Calling Birds: Symbolize the Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Five Gold Rings: Represent the first five books of the Bible, known as the Pentateuch.

Six Geese a-Laying: Symbolize the six days of creation.

Seven Swans a-Swimming: Represent the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Eight Maids a-Milking: Symbolize the Beatitudes.

Nine Ladies Dancing: Represent the nine fruits of the Spirit.

Ten Lords a-Leaping: Symbolize the Ten Commandments.

Eleven Pipers Piping: Represent the eleven faithful apostles.

Twelve Drummers Drumming: Reflect the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed.
