Church News

Ponderings about St. Peter's

How many of you remember a time when you did not worry about locking your doors? You basically had an “Open Door Policy”. Churches were open so that people could enter the sanctuary and pray at any time. These things began to change from the 1950s to the 1970s. In my home church at that time the minister would find the altar candles lit and pushed back toward the hangings, and there was a concern about fire. For this reason, and others, churches began locking their doors. Today we are concerned about the safety of the congregations and the possibility of someone entering the church to do harm during a service.

In trying to research the history of church security, it is recorded that in the early days of the “modern” church, the Swiss Guard, founded in 1506, was tasked with the protection of the Pope and the church. For St. Peter’s UCC our Council Minutes from February 1946 reveal a discussion about locking the doors of the church each night. By June 1946, they began locking the church building. In June 1950, the church Council discussed the need for locking internal doors to protect against theft. “Kitchen valuables” among other things had been stolen. Today your church council is developing a plan so that we are prepared in case there is an attempt to do harm. “The prudent see danger and take refuge, but the simple keep going and pay the penalty.” May we pray that there is never a time when we must put our plan into action.

Will the groundhog see his shadow?

Punxsutawney, 1886 marked the first time that Groundhog Day appeared in the local newspaper. The Groundhog Day ceremony which is held at Punxsutawney in western Pennsylvania, centers on a semi-mythical groundhog named Punxsutawney Phil. It has become the most frequently attended ceremony. It is a tradition observed regionally in the United States and Canada on February 2. It derives from the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if a groundhog emerges from its burrow on this day and sees its shadow, it will retreat to its den and winter will go on for six more weeks; if it does not see its shadow, spring will arrive early. The earliest mention of Groundhog Day is an entry on February 2, 1840, in the diary of James L. Morris of Morgantown, in Pennsylvania Dutch Country, according to the book on the subject by Don Yoder.
